## **Simon Rika - Submission on the draft copyright Code of Practice for S92A**

I don't get it. Here is the section:

92A Internet service provider must have policy for terminating accounts of repeat infringers

“(1) An Internet service provider must adopt and reasonably implement a policy that provides for termination, in appropriate circumstances, of the account with that Internet service provider of a repeat infringer.

“(2) In subsection (1), repeat infringer means a person who repeatedly infringes the copyright in a work by using 1 or more of the Internet services of the Internet service provider to do a restricted act without the consent of the copyright owner.

Why does your "code of conduct" go far beyond the legal requirements?

Here is ALL you need:

"Any user convicted in a court of law of repeat copyright infringement shall have their account terminated, if so ordered by that court."

That is a policy that allows for termination of an account IN APPROPRIATE CIRCUMSTANCES . That one sentence totally complies with section 92A and DOESN'T take away our rights to face our accuser, see the evidence against us and to be considered innocent until found guilty by a court of law. So why are you people insisting on taking away my rights?
